

# DIY Denim Patchwork Highland Cow Appliqué

## DENIM PATCHWORK HIGHLAND COW APPLIQUE TUTORIAL

**Overall Width** 22cm

**Overall Height** 25cm

**Ear height** 5cm

**Muzzle width** 8cm

**Muzzle Pocket** 6x4cm

**Udder width** 4cm

**Tail length** 9cm

**DENIM TYPE USED**

- Deep Indigo Drill
- Acid Wash Denim
- Stripe Indigo Denim
- Raw Selvedge Denim
- Frayed Edge Details

**USA QUILTING & SEWING METHODS USED**

- Applique Stitch**  
Satin Stitch  
15mm, 2mm width.
- Blanket Stitch**  
All at 1.5mm stitch length, length, 2mm width.
- Frayed Edge Stitched**  
All at 1.5mm stitch length, length, 2mm width.
- Fuss Cutting**  
Precision cutting around patterns.
- Layered Piecing**  
For the dimensional body.
- Raw Edge Fraying**  
For texture.
- Surface Embellishment**  
Button and bead placement.
- Top-Stitching**  
For pocket details.

**1 Preparation**  
Trace templates onto freezer paper. Iron onto chosen denim fabrics.

**2 Cutting**  
Fussy-cut all pieces with a 0.5cm fray margin.

**3 Layering & Basting**  
Arrange pieces on background fabric, 35x40cm. Use fabric glue or basting spray.

**4 Edge Stitching**  
Use "Indigo Blue" thread for most. "Ecru" for horns.

**Base Fabric - Ecru Linen/Cotton Blend, 35x40cm**

Create a charming Highland cow appliqué using recycled denim pieces! This project combines quilting, patchwork, and appliqué techniques, resulting in a rustic and adorable design perfect for pillows, wall art, or bags. Follow this detailed guide from start to finish.

## **Step 1: Gather Your Materials**

Before starting, make sure you have everything ready:

- Assorted denim fabric pieces (different shades for contrast)
- Base fabric (cotton or canvas, approx. 20" x 24")
- Fusible web or interfacing (optional but helpful)
- Fabric scissors and small detail scissors
- Sewing machine or needle for hand stitching
- Thread (matching and contrasting colors)
- Fabric chalk or washable marker
- Pins or clips
- Iron and ironing board

Tip: Using old jeans with different washes will give your cow a beautiful patchwork effect.

## **Step 2: Create and Transfer the Pattern**

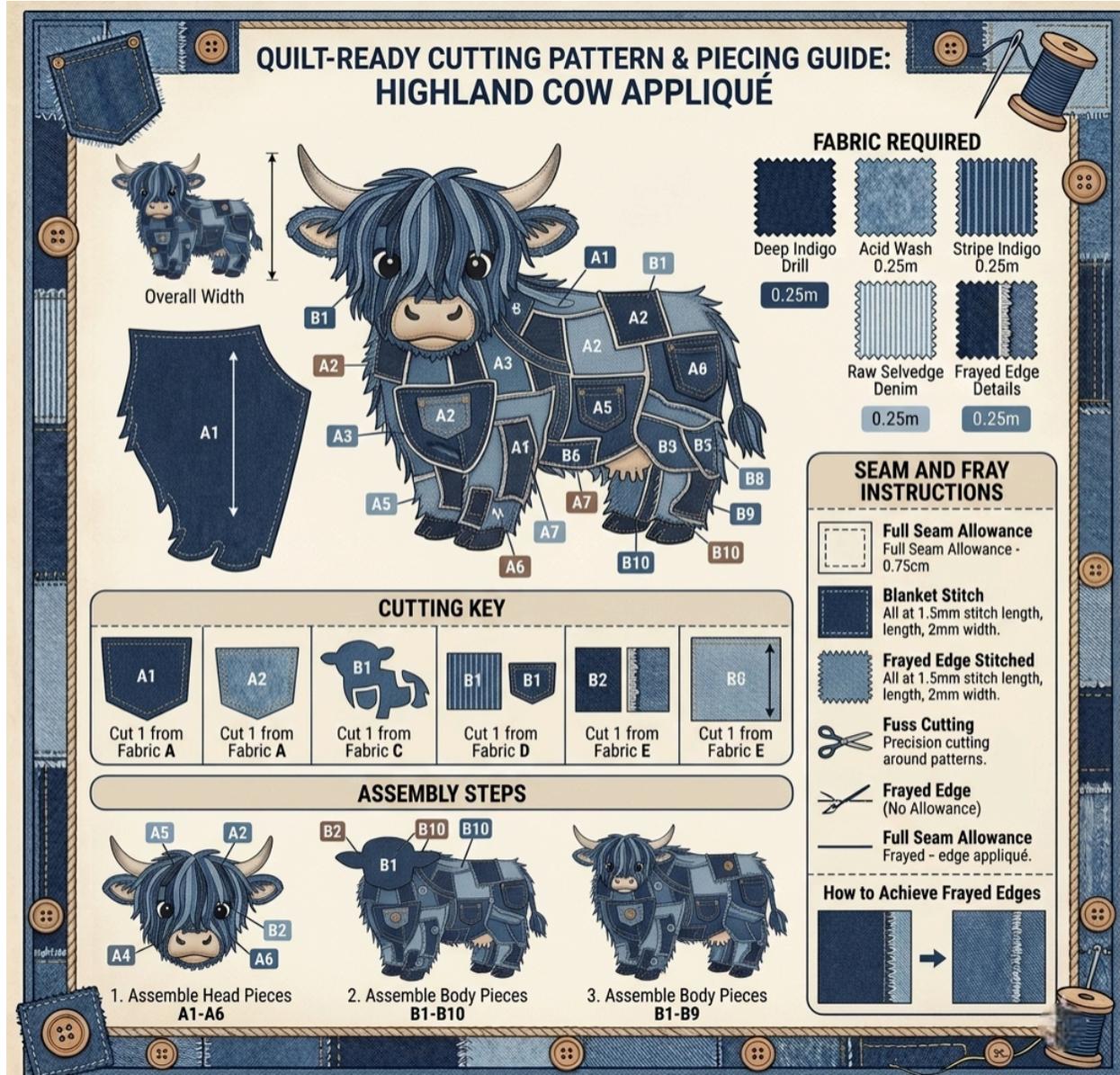
Draw or print a Highland cow template that includes:

- Full body outline
- Head and face details
- Ears, horns, legs, and tail

Steps:

- Sketch the cow on paper or print a template
- Break the body into patchwork sections (like puzzle pieces)
- Trace each section onto paper or directly onto fusible web
- Transfer the pattern pieces onto the wrong side of your denim

Make sure to label each piece if needed to keep track during assembly.



## 🧩 Step 3: Cut and Build the Patchwork Body

Now it's time to bring the body together:

- Cut denim pieces following your pattern sections
- Mix different shades for a natural patchwork look
- Arrange pieces on your base fabric before sewing
- Slightly overlap edges or align them neatly depending on your style

Sewing:

- Use a straight stitch or zigzag stitch to secure each patch
- Start from the center and work outward
- Press pieces with an iron as you go

This step forms the main body structure of your cow.

## **Step 4: Create the Shaggy Hair and Fringe**

The Highland cow's signature look comes from its shaggy hair:

- Cut thin strips of denim (about ¼" to ½" wide)
- Vary lengths for a natural effect
- Fray the edges by pulling threads slightly

Attach the fringe:

- Layer strips across the head area
- Stitch along the top edge to secure
- Let the ends hang freely for texture

Repeat for the top of the head and slightly over the eyes.

## **Step 5: Make and Attach the Head & Face**

Now focus on the facial features:

- Cut out face base (lighter fabric works well)
- Add eyes using fabric circles or embroidery
- Stitch the nose and mouth with embroidery thread
- Attach ears and horns (use lighter or contrasting denim)

Assembly:

- Position the face on the body
- Stitch around edges using a tight zigzag or appliqué stitch
- Add small details like highlights in the eyes for personality

## **Step 6: Add Legs, Hooves, and Tail**

Construct the lower parts:

- Cut leg shapes from denim
- Use darker fabric for hooves
- Layer and stitch each leg individually

Attach:

- Position legs evenly under the body
- Stitch securely with reinforced seams

Tail:

- Create a thin strip of denim
- Add a small fringe at the end
- Attach to the back of the cow



## **Step 7: Attach the Appliqué to the Base**

Now secure everything onto your final background:

- Center the cow on your base fabric
- Pin or clip in place
- Stitch around the entire cow using a zigzag or blanket stitch

Optional:

- Add batting underneath for a quilted effect
- Quilt lightly around the cow to add texture



## **Step 8: Finishing Touches**

Bring your project to life with final details:

- Lightly fray some denim edges for a rustic look
- Press the entire piece with an iron

- Trim excess threads
- Add decorative stitching if desired

Optional uses:

- Turn into a pillow cover
- Frame as wall art
- Sew onto a tote bag



## **Extra Tips for Best Results**

- Work slowly when sewing small pieces
- Use denim needles if sewing with a machine
- Mix textures and shades for depth
- Don't worry about perfection—rustic charm is part of the design
