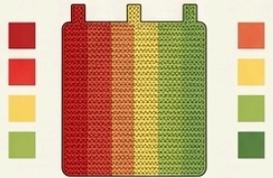
### ULTIMATE DIY TUTORIAL: 6-POCKET CROCHET WALL ORGANIZER



U.S. CROCHET STITCH LEGEND			
1	ch - Chain (Foundation)		7 popcorn - Popcorn Stitch (Flower Petals) Work 5 dc in one space, join, ch 2. Creates the raised petal effect.
2	sc - Single Crochet Short, dense stitch for main panels & pockets.		8 sc inc - Single Crochet Increase
3	hdc - Half Double Crochet		9 sc dec - Single Crochet Decrease
4	dc - Double Crochet		10 fringe - Fringe Making
5	tr - Treble Crochet		
6	sl st - Slip Stitch

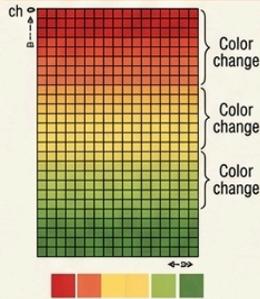

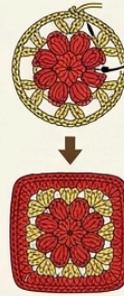


#### DETAILED INSTRUCTIONS - TOP HALF

##### PANEL R1-R40 (Multi-Color Gradient)



##### FLOWER POCKETS (x2)



**Flower Motif Core:**  
Step 1: MR, 12 sc.  
Step 2: [ch 2] around.  
Step 3: Round of dc.

**Making it a Pocket:**  
Step 4: Add sc border to make it square.

Follow color key: (Red-mix and Yellow-mix flowers)

#### DETAILED INSTRUCTIONS - BOTTOM HALF

##### SMILEY POCKETS (x2)



Solid sc pocket with increase for curve.  
Top edge: sc border.

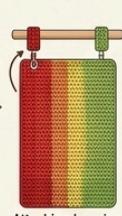


Embroidery pattern for smiley face.  
Chain stitch for mouth.

##### FRINGE POCKETS (x2)



Wrap yarn, tie, cut, trim.



Attaching hanging tabs (sc straps) to panel and rod.



Arranging and sewing pockets in place.

##### FINAL ASSEMBLY

Create a beautiful and functional crochet wall organizer with this detailed step-by-step guide. This project combines practical storage with charming handmade design, featuring flower pockets, smiley faces, and decorative fringe. Whether you're a beginner with basic skills or an experienced crocheter, you'll be able to follow along and complete this piece from start to finish.

## **Materials and Tools You'll Need**

Before starting, gather the following materials:

- Medium-weight yarn (worsted weight) in multiple colors:
  - Red
  - Yellow
  - Green
  - White (for flower details)
- Crochet hook (size H/5.0 mm recommended)
- Yarn needle (for sewing and weaving ends)
- Scissors
- Wooden dowel or stick (for hanging)
- Tapestry needle (for embroidery details)
- Stitch markers (optional but helpful)

## **Understanding Basic Stitches**

Make sure you're comfortable with these U.S. crochet stitches:

- ch (chain)
- sc (single crochet)
- hdc (half double crochet)
- dc (double crochet)
- tr (treble crochet)
- sl st (slip stitch)
- sc inc (single crochet increase)
- sc dec (single crochet decrease)
- popcorn stitch (used for flower petals)

## **Step 1: Creating the Main Rectangle Panel**

Start by making the base panel that will hold all pockets.

- Chain a foundation row wide enough for your organizer (approx. 35–45 chains depending on desired width).
- Row 1: Starting from the second chain, work sc across.
- Continue working in rows using sc stitches for durability.
- Create a color gradient by changing yarn colors every few rows:
  - Begin with red at the top
  - Transition to orange/yellow
  - Finish with green at the bottom

Work approximately 35–40 rows total to form a large rectangle.

At the top edge:

- Add small loops (using chains and slip stitches) spaced evenly across the width. These will hold the wooden dowel.

## **Step 2: Making the Flower Pockets (Make 2)**

These decorative top pockets feature a flower motif.

### **Flower Center:**

- Round 1: Create a magic ring (MR), work 12 sc into the ring, join.
- Round 2: Chain 2 between stitches to create spacing.
- Round 3: Work dc stitches around to build structure.

### **Petals:**

- Use popcorn stitches:
  - Work 5 dc in the same stitch, remove hook, insert into first dc, pull loop through.
- Repeat around to form petals.

### **Turning into a Square:**

- Add sc stitches around the circle.
- Increase at corners to form a square shape.

### **Finishing:**

- Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.

## **Step 3: Making the Smiley Pockets (Make 2)**

These middle pockets are fun and expressive.

### **Base Pocket:**

- Chain a foundation row (about 20–25 chains).
- Work in sc rows to create a slightly curved rectangle:
  - Use increases (sc inc) at the edges to round the shape.
- Continue until the pocket reaches desired height.

### **Top Edge:**

- Add a border of sc stitches for a clean finish.

### **Embroidering the Face:**

- Use black yarn:
  - Eyes: small vertical stitches
  - Mouth: curved chain stitch or backstitch

## **Step 4: Making the Fringe Pockets (Make 2)**

These are the bottom pockets with tassels.

### **Pocket Base:**

- Crochet a rectangle similar to the smiley pockets, but slightly taller.
- Use solid sc rows for a sturdy structure.

### **Creating Fringe:**

- Cut multiple strands of yarn (same length).
- Fold strands in half and attach along the bottom edge using a lark's head knot.
- Trim evenly to create neat tassels.

## **Step 5: Assembling the Organizer**

Now bring all parts together.

### **Attaching Pockets:**

- Lay the main panel flat.
- Arrange pockets in 3 rows:
  - Top row: 2 flower pockets
  - Middle row: 2 smiley pockets
  - Bottom row: 2 fringe pockets
- Use a yarn needle to sew each pocket onto the panel:
  - Sew sides and bottom edges
  - Leave the top open

### **Spacing Tips:**

- Keep equal spacing between pockets
- Align them symmetrically for a polished look

## **Step 6: Adding the Hanging Rod**

- Insert the wooden dowel through the loops at the top of the panel.
- Cut two strands of yarn or rope.
- Tie securely to both ends of the dowel to create a hanger.

## **Step 7: Final Touches**

- Weave in all loose ends.
- Adjust fringe for even length.
- Gently block the piece if needed to improve shape.

## **Your Organizer Is Ready!**

You now have a beautiful handmade crochet wall organizer with six functional pockets. Use it to store:

- Craft supplies
- Mail or documents
- Small toys
- Accessories
