

# Crochet Clover & Rosebud Bracelet

This delicate crochet bracelet combines tiny clover petals, textured leaves, and rolled rosebuds into an elegant adjustable accessory. The project uses fine crochet thread and micro-crochet techniques to create a lightweight floral bracelet with beautiful detail.

The bracelet is adjustable thanks to a sliding knot closure, making it comfortable for most wrist sizes.

This tutorial follows the exact structure and construction shown in the chart and explains every step carefully so even someone new to miniature crochet can complete the project successfully.

## Skill Level

Intermediate

This project is small and detailed, so patience and careful stitching are important. If you already know basic crochet stitches and how to work with fine thread, you should be able to make this bracelet successfully.

## Finished Bracelet Size

Adjustable length

The finished bracelet can fit most wrist sizes because of the sliding knot closure.

## Materials Needed

- Size 10/20 cotton embroidery floss or micro-crochet thread
- Main flower color thread (dark red or burgundy recommended)
- Leaf color thread (olive or sage green recommended)
- Neutral cord for bracelet band
- Steel crochet hook: 0.6 mm – 1.0 mm
- Gold plated beads: 4 mm – 6 mm
- Yarn needle or sewing needle
- Scissors
- Optional jewelry glue



## Recommended Colors

You may use any colors you like, but the original bracelet uses:

- Burgundy red for clover petals and rosebuds
- Soft green for leaves
- Cream or beige for bracelet cord
- Gold beads for decoration

## Before You Start ✨

Because this is micro crochet, tension matters a lot.

Try to:

- Keep stitches even
- Avoid pulling too tightly
- Use good lighting
- Work slowly
- Count stitches carefully

If your petals begin curling too much, loosen your tension slightly.

If they become floppy, tighten your tension a little.

## Step 1: Make the Clover Petals (Make 4) 🍀

Each clover petal is shaped like a tiny crochet heart.

You will make four identical heart-shaped petals and later join them together into a clover flower.

### Start with a Magic Ring

Create a magic ring loosely enough so you can comfortably place all stitches inside.

### Round Inside the Magic Ring

Work the following sequence into the magic ring:

- ch 2
- 3 tr
- 3 dc
- ch 1
- 1 tr (this forms the pointed bottom of the heart)
- ch 1
- 3 dc
- 3 tr
- ch 2
- sl st into the magic ring

# MICRO-CROCHET STITCH DIAGRAM: CLOVER & ROSEBUD BRACELET COMPONENTS

## SYMBOL KEY

### BASIC STITCHES:

○ = Chain (ch)  
Oval loop foundation.

● = Slip Stitch (sl st)  
Small dot,  
non-stitch join.

✕ = Single Crochet (sc)  
Short cross,  
dense fabric.

T = Half Double Crochet (hdc)  
Short T-shape.

T = Double Crochet (dc)  
T-shape with one  
diagonal crossbar.

T = Treble Crochet (tr)  
T-shape with two  
diagonal crossbars.

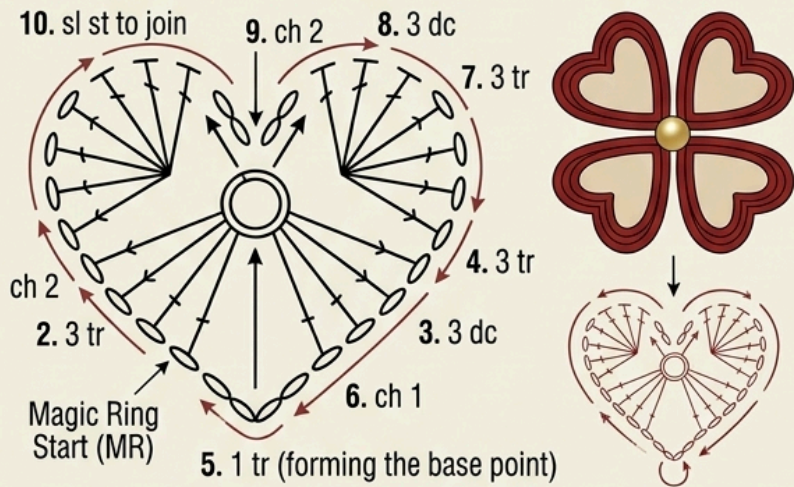

● = 4mm Bead

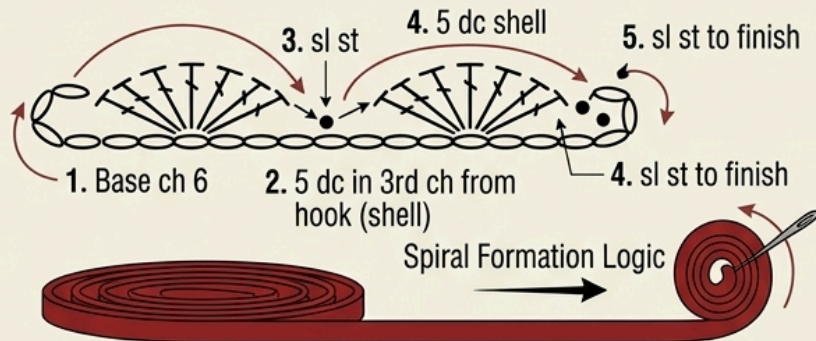

## SECTION 1: THE CLOVER PETAL (Make 4 Hearts)

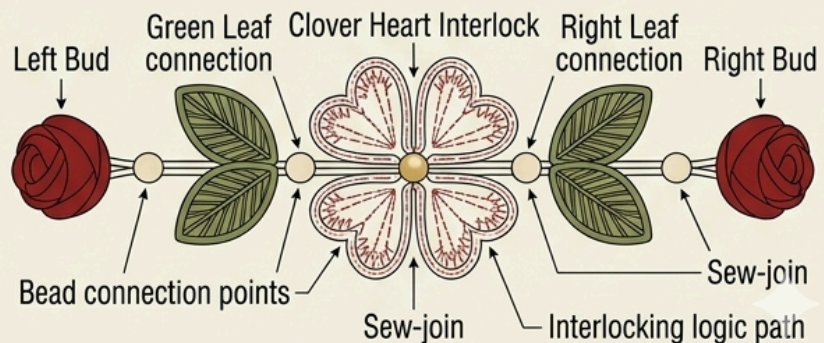


## SECTION 2: THE ROSEBUD (Make 2 Spirals)



## OVERALL BRACELET ASSEMBLY SCHEMA

(Simplified Technical View)



## Understanding the Shape

The first side of stitches creates one rounded half of the heart.

The center treble crochet creates the pointed bottom.

The second group mirrors the first side and completes the heart shape.

## Tighten the Ring

Once all stitches are complete:

- Hold the stitches gently
- Pull the magic ring tail slowly
- Close the center tightly

You should now have a tiny heart-shaped petal.

## Shape the Petal

Use your fingers to gently flatten and shape the heart.

The top should look rounded.

The bottom should form a neat point.

## Repeat

Make 3 more petals exactly the same.

At the end you should have:

- 4 matching heart petals

## Step 2: Assemble the Clover

Now you will join the four petals into a complete clover flower.

## Arrange the Petals

Lay the petals flat on your table.

Position them so:

- The pointed ends meet in the center
- The rounded tops face outward

This creates a four-leaf clover shape.

## **Sew the Petals Together**

Thread a yarn needle with matching thread.

Using small stitches:

- Join the bottom points together
- Sew neighboring petals side-by-side

Keep stitches tight but invisible.

## **Add the Center Bead**

Place one gold bead in the middle of the clover.

Sew the bead securely through all layers.

The bead helps:

- Strengthen the flower
- Hide joining stitches
- Add decorative shine

## **Final Flower Check**

Your finished clover should:

- Lay flat
- Have four evenly spaced petals
- Look symmetrical

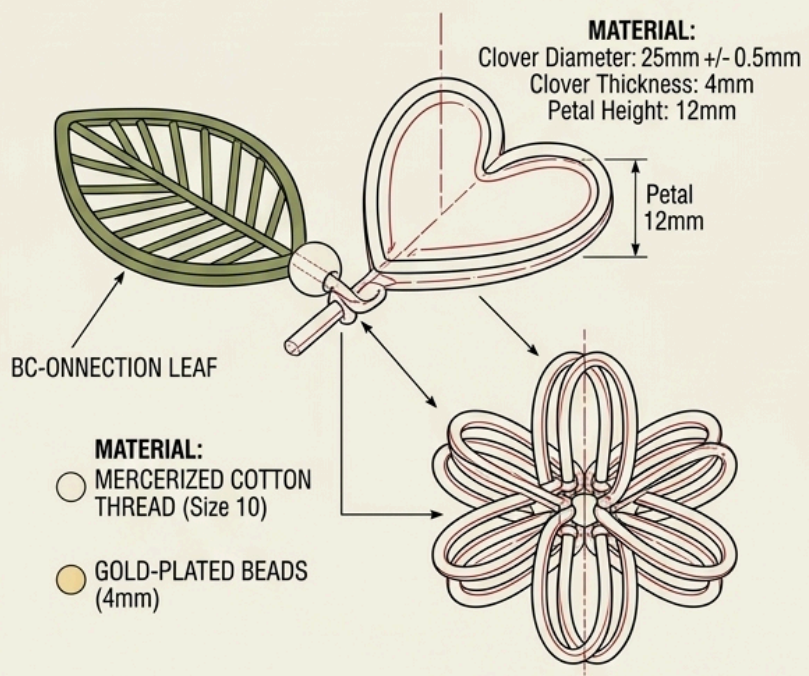
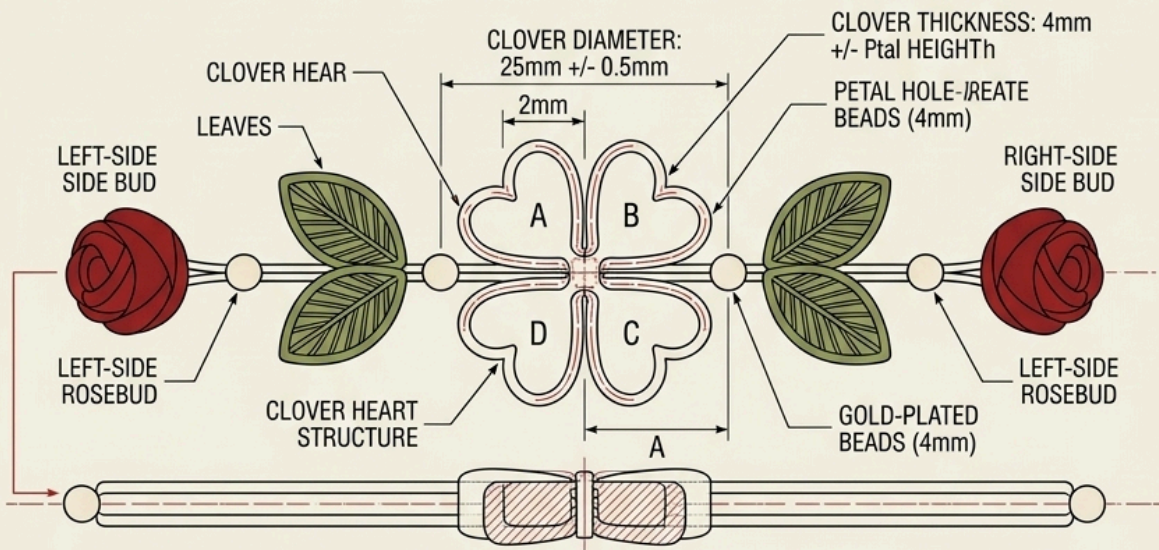
Set the clover aside.

## **Step 3: Make the Leaves (Make 2)**

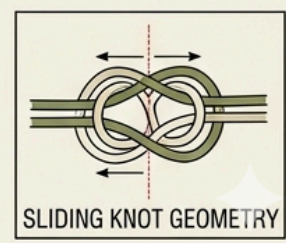
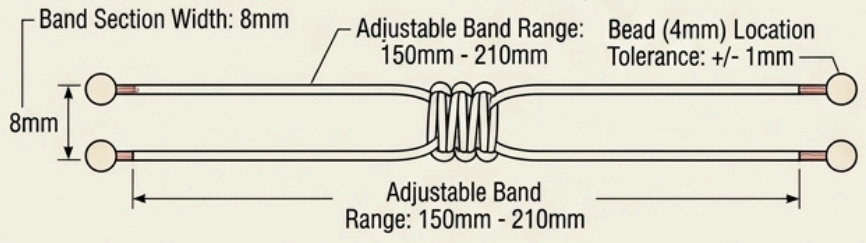
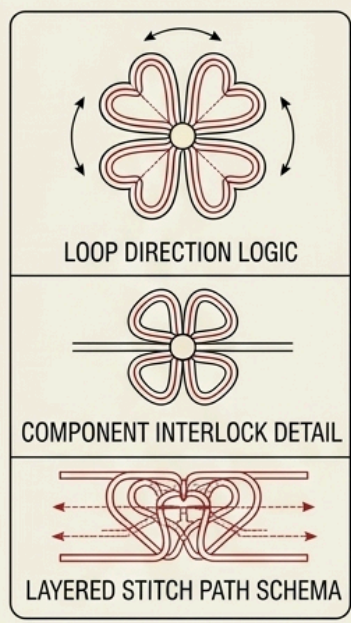
The leaves are worked in rows around a base chain.

They create an elegant pointed leaf shape.

# CLOVER & ROSEBUD BRACELET ASSEMBLY SCHEMA (SCHEMATIC ONLY)



- MATERIAL:**
- MERCERIZED COTTON THREAD (Size 10)
  - GOLD-PLATED BEADS (4mm)



## **Start the Base Chain**

Chain a short foundation chain.

The chart shows a narrow leaf, so keep the chain relatively small.

## **Work Along One Side**

Into the chain, work:

- sc
- hdc
- dc
- tr
- dc

Increase stitch height gradually toward the center.

## **Create the Leaf Tip**

At the top point:

- Work multiple stitches into one chain space

This creates the pointed leaf tip.

The point section includes:

- dc
- dc
- dc

## **Work Down the Opposite Side**

Continue along the opposite side of the chain using mirrored stitches:

- dc
- tr
- dc
- hdc
- sc

## **Close the Leaf**

Finish with:

- sl st at the base

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing.

## Shape the Leaf

Flatten gently with fingers.

The leaf should:

- Taper at both ends
- Have a slightly raised center
- Look balanced

## Repeat

Make one more identical leaf.

## Step 4: Make the Rosebuds (Make 2)

The rosebuds are formed by crocheting a curled strip and rolling it into a flower.

### Begin the Rosebud Strip

Chain a short strip.

The strip forms the spiral petals of the rose.

### Crochet the Strip

Work rows of:

- dc
- hdc

The stitches naturally create curling.

As you crochet:

- The strip should begin twisting slightly
- This curling helps form the rose shape

### Roll the Flower

Starting from one end:

- Roll the strip tightly at first
- Continue rolling outward loosely

This creates realistic rose layers.

## Secure the Bottom

Using a yarn needle:

- Sew through the bottom several times
- Lock the spiral in place

Do not sew through the top petals.

## Shape the Rose

Use fingers to gently spread outer petals.

The flower should resemble a small rosebud.

## Repeat

Create a second rosebud.

## Step 5: Create the Bracelet Band

The bracelet base is made using square macramé knots or Roman cord knots.

## Cut Cord Lengths

Cut cords longer than needed.

You need extra length for:

- Knotting
- Adjustable closure
- Finishing ends

## Begin the Macramé Band

Secure cords to your workspace.

Tie square knots repeatedly.

## How to Make a Square Knot

## First Half

- Cross left cord over center cords
- Bring right cord over left cord
- Pass right cord under center cords
- Pull through left loop

Tighten gently.

## Second Half

- Cross right cord over center cords
- Bring left cord over right cord
- Pass left cord under center cords
- Pull through right loop

Pull tight.

One full square knot is complete.

## Continue Knotting

Repeat square knots until the bracelet reaches desired length.

Remember:

- The sliding closure will add extra length later
- Do not make the band too long

## Check Width

The bracelet should:

- Remain flat
- Feel flexible
- Have even knots

## Step 6: Assemble All Components

Now the bracelet begins to come together beautifully.

## Arrange the Pieces

Lay everything in this order:

- Rosebud
- Leaf
- Clover
- Leaf
- Rosebud

Center the clover carefully.

## **Sew the Leaves**

Attach one leaf on each side of the clover.

Use tiny stitches through the back only.

## **Attach the Rosebuds**

Sew each rosebud beside the leaves.

Make sure:

- The flowers face upward
- The arrangement stays symmetrical

## **Attach to Bracelet Band**

Position the floral arrangement in the center of the bracelet cord.

Sew securely through the back of the clover and leaves.

Avoid visible stitches on the front.

## **Reinforce Everything**

Go back and strengthen all joins:

- Flower center
- Leaves
- Rosebuds
- Bracelet connection points

Micro crochet jewelry experiences movement and tension, so reinforcement is important.

## **Step 7: Final Floral Attachment**

This step secures the decorative section permanently.

## Inspect the Placement

Check:

- Flower alignment
- Leaf angle
- Rosebud symmetry

Adjust before final tightening.

## Add Extra Stitches if Needed

If any piece feels loose:

- Add hidden stitches underneath

The arrangement should not wobble.

## Hide Thread Ends

Weave all ends through the back carefully.

Trim excess thread neatly.

## Step 8: Finish the Adjustable Closure ✨

The sliding knot closure makes the bracelet adjustable and comfortable.

### Add End Beads

Thread one bead onto each cord end.

Tie knots behind the beads to secure them.

### Create the Sliding Knot

Cross the bracelet ends over each other.

Using an additional short cord:

- Tie square knots around both bracelet cords

Do not knot too tightly.

The cords must still slide smoothly.

## Test the Closure

Pull the bracelet open and closed several times.

It should:

- Slide easily
- Hold securely
- Adjust comfortably

## Final Touches

Trim excess cord neatly.

Optionally:

- Add a tiny drop of glue to knots
- Let dry fully

## Finished Bracelet

Your Crochet Clover & Rosebud Bracelet is now complete.

The finished piece features:

- Four-petal clover centerpiece
- Elegant crochet leaves
- Rolled rosebuds
- Adjustable macramé closure
- Decorative gold bead accents

This bracelet makes a beautiful:

- Handmade gift
- Spring accessory
- Friendship bracelet
- Cottagecore jewelry piece
- Botanical crochet project

## Helpful Tips for Success

### If Petals Curl Too Much

Use a slightly larger hook.

### **If Stitches Look Loose**

Use tighter tension or smaller thread.

### **If the Clover Looks Uneven**

Block the petals lightly before sewing together.

### **If the Rosebuds Unroll**

Add more stitches through the bottom center.

### **If the Bracelet Feels Stiff**

Loosen the macramé knots slightly.

## **Care Instructions**

- Store flat
- Avoid soaking in water
- Clean gently with a soft cloth
- Keep away from perfumes and harsh chemicals
