

Quilted Chicken Tea Cozy

Create a beautiful quilted chicken tea cozy with patchwork details, appliqué decorations, and soft quilting texture! This cozy is not only functional for keeping your teapot warm, but it also makes a charming farmhouse-style kitchen decoration.

This tutorial is written for beginners and experienced sewists alike, with detailed explanations so you can confidently complete the project from start to finish.

1 PATTERN & FABRIC CUTTING



DETAILED CUTTING LIST:

- Body panels (2x) - 30cm x 28cm
- Wing patches (4x) - 12cm x 15cm
- Comb pieces (2x) - 8cm x 7cm
- Wattle pieces (4x) - 5cm x 6cm
- Beak (1x) - 4cm x 4cm
- Tail feathers (multiple)

Finished Project Size

The finished tea cozy fits most standard medium teapots approximately:

- 10–12 inches wide
- 8–10 inches tall

You can slightly enlarge or reduce the pattern depending on your teapot size.

Materials and Supplies

Fabrics

- Assorted cotton quilting fabrics in beige, cream, brown, tan, red, mustard, and floral prints
- Backing fabric
- Lining fabric
- Small scraps for appliqué pieces

Batting

- Cotton batting or insulated batting

Sewing Supplies

- Sewing machine
- Hand sewing needle
- Thread matching fabrics
- Fabric scissors
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Quilting ruler
- Pins or clips
- Fabric marking pen
- Iron and ironing board
- Fusible web (optional for appliqué)
- Embroidery thread (optional)
- Bias binding or fabric strips for binding

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Understanding the Tea Cozy Structure

This chicken tea cozy is made from:

- A quilted outer shell
- Batting for insulation
- Inner lining
- Decorative appliqué pieces
- Quilted texture
- Final side seams and binding

The cozy is built in layers, just like a small quilt.

Step 1: Pattern and Fabric Cutting

Before sewing, prepare and cut all your fabric pieces carefully.

Main Body Panels

Cut:

- 2 body panels measuring 30 cm x 28 cm
- These form the front and back of the chicken tea cozy

You can trace a rounded chicken-body shape onto paper first, then use it as a template.

The body should have:

- Rounded top
- Slightly wider bottom
- Flat lower edge

Wing Pieces

Cut:

- 4 wing feather shapes
- Approximately 12 cm x 15 cm

Use several coordinating fabrics for layered feathers.

Comb Pieces

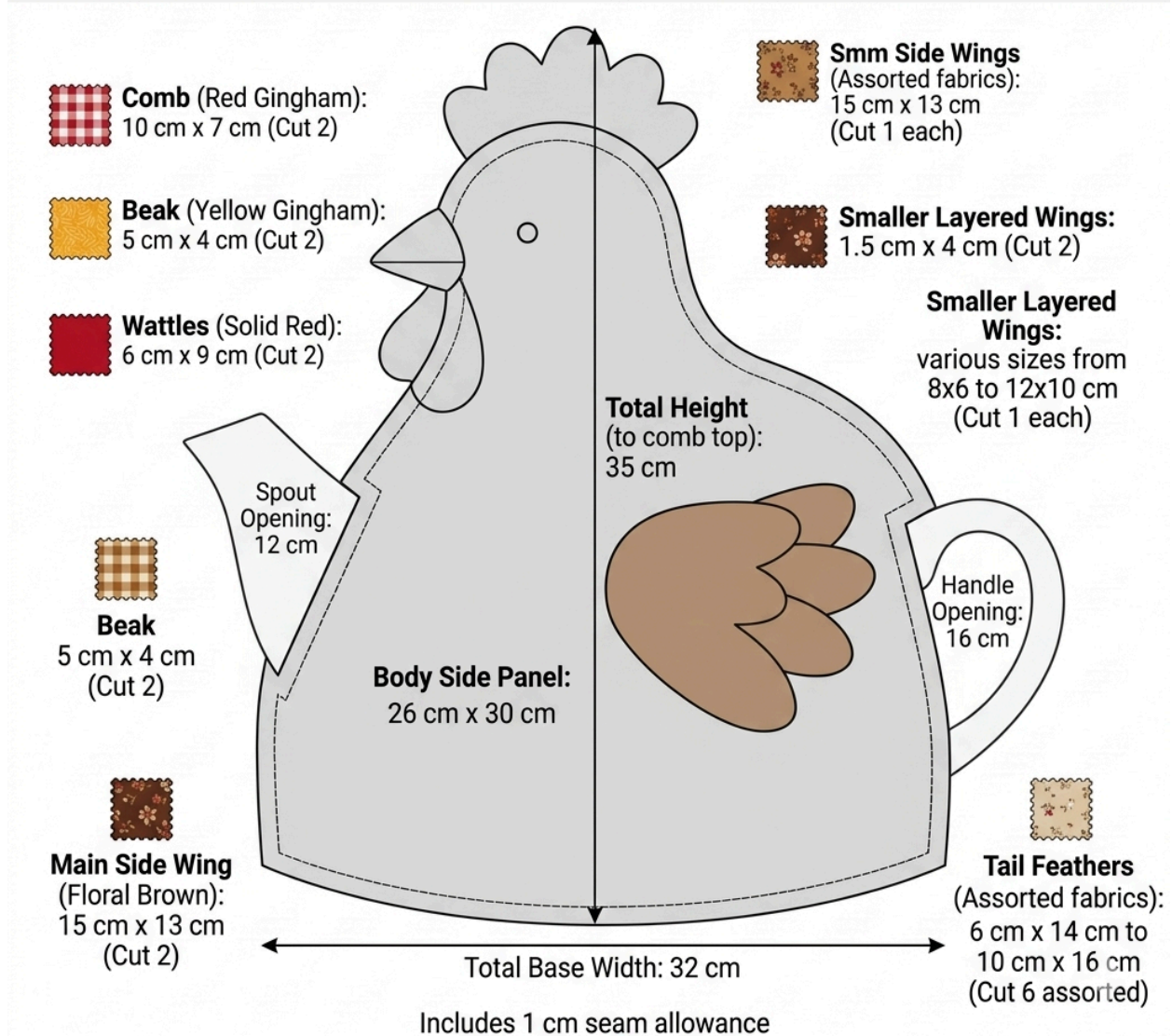
Cut:

- 2 comb shapes
- About 8 cm x 7 cm

Use bright red fabric.

PROFESSIONAL TEA COZY PATTERN: PATCHWORK HEN

Design and Measurement Guide



Wattle Pieces

Cut:

- 4 teardrop-shaped wattle pieces
- Approximately 5 cm x 6 cm

Beak

Cut:

- 1 diamond or triangle shape
- Approximately 4 cm x 4 cm
- Use yellow or mustard fabric

Tail Feathers

Cut multiple feather-shaped pieces in different sizes and prints.

Use:

- Browns
- Creams
- Florals
- Polka dots

The variety creates dimension and visual interest.

Step 2: Creating the Patchwork Top

The body of the chicken is assembled from small patchwork squares.

Cut Patchwork Squares

Cut multiple:

- 6 cm x 6 cm squares

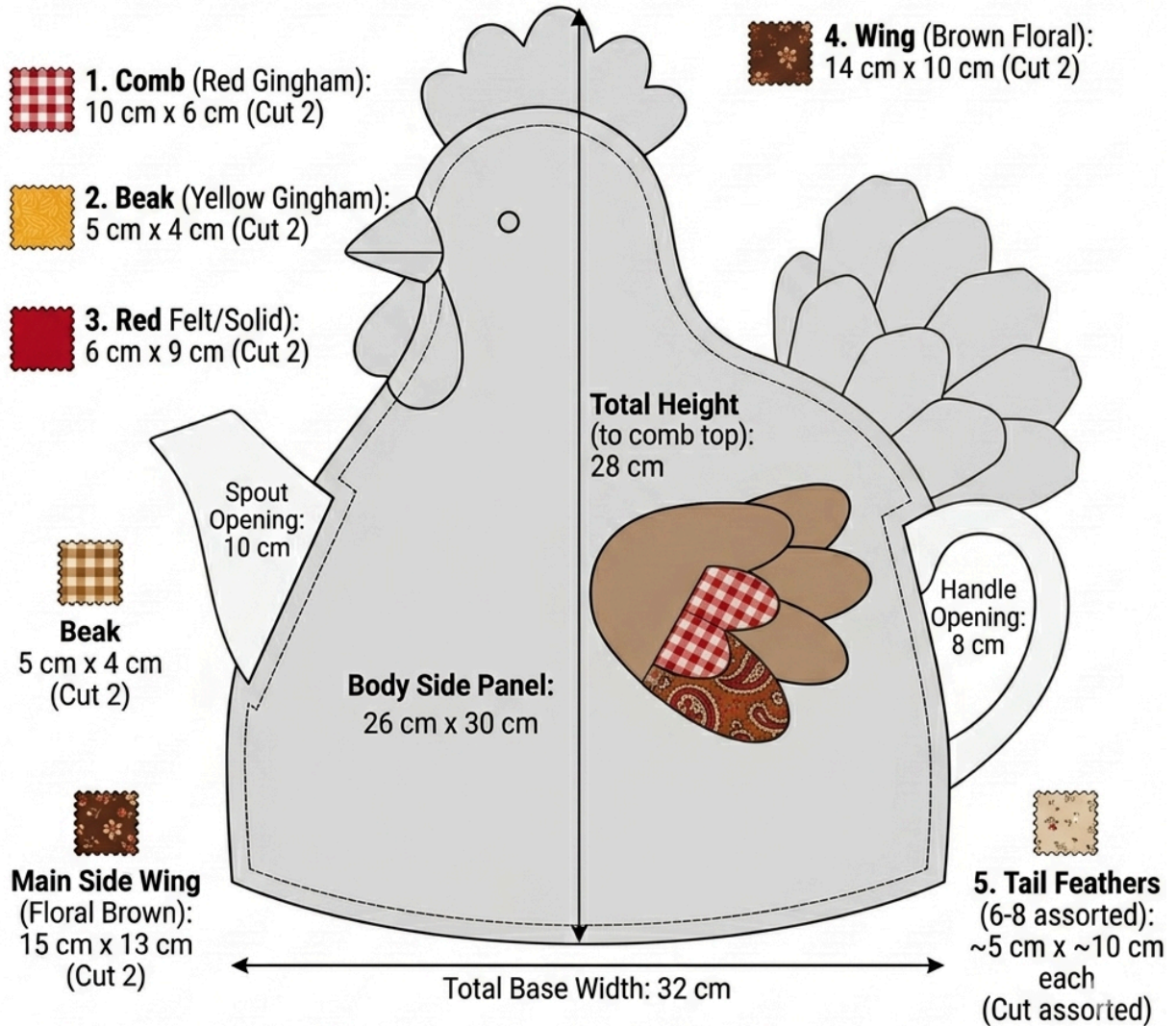
Use a mixture of coordinating quilting cottons.

Try combining:

- Tiny florals
- Vintage prints
- Dots
- Tone-on-tone fabrics

PROFESSIONAL TEA COZY PATTERN: PATCHWORK HEN

Detailed Professional Pattern for a Hen Teapot Cozy



Measurements are for a cozy fitting a standard 1.25L teapot. Seam allowances of 0.5 cm NOT included.

Arrange the Squares

Lay the squares out before sewing.

Alternate:

- Light fabrics
- Medium fabrics
- Dark fabrics

This creates balance and helps the chicken shape stand out beautifully.

Sew the Squares Together

Place two squares right sides together.

Sew using:

- ¼ inch seam allowance

Continue adding squares row by row.

After each seam:

- Press seams open or to one side

Pressing properly is extremely important for flat quilting later.

Assemble the Full Patchwork Panel

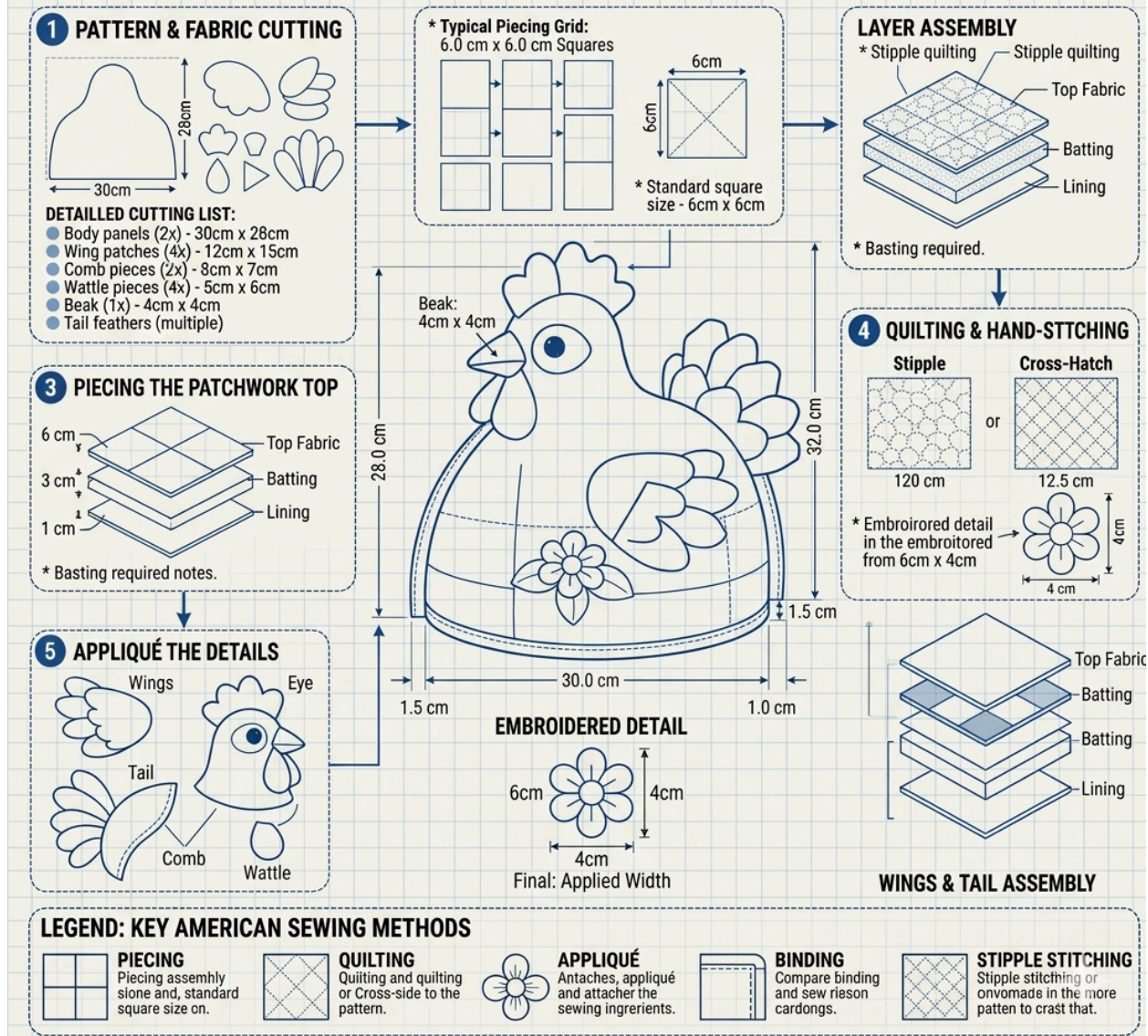
Continue until the patchwork section is large enough for the chicken body pattern.

Then:

- Place your chicken body template over the patchwork
- Cut the body shape carefully

Repeat for the second body panel.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS FOR QUILTED CHICKEN TEA COZY



Step 3: Making the Quilt Sandwich

Now you will build the quilted layers.

Each side of the tea cozy is made from:

1. Top fabric
2. Batting
3. Lining

This is called a quilt sandwich.

Layer the Fabrics

For each body panel:

- Place lining fabric wrong side down
- Add batting in the middle
- Place patchwork top right side up

Smooth all wrinkles carefully.

Baste the Layers

You can baste using:

- Quilting pins
- Safety pins
- Temporary spray adhesive
- Hand basting stitches

The layers must stay secure during quilting.

Step 4: Quilting the Tea Cozy

Quilting gives texture, durability, and structure.

You can choose between:

Stipple Quilting

This uses flowing curved lines.

It creates:

- Soft texture
- Handmade appearance
- Vintage quilted look

To do this:

- Lower your feed dogs if using free-motion quilting
- Move fabric slowly and evenly
- Stitch looping curves continuously

Cross-Hatch Quilting

This creates diamond shapes.

Mark diagonal lines across the body panel.

Then stitch:

- One direction first
- Rotate the piece
- Stitch the opposite direction

Spacing should be even.

Approximately:

- 1½ to 2 inches apart

This style gives a classic farmhouse look.

Quilting Tips for Beginners

- Start quilting from the center outward
- Use walking foot for even feeding
- Quilt slowly
- Practice on scrap fabric first
- Keep hands relaxed while guiding fabric

Step 5: Making the Appliqué Details

The chicken decorations bring the cozy to life.

Preparing the Wing

Layer feather pieces slightly overlapping.

Arrange from largest to smallest.

You can:

- Fuse with fusible web
- Pin temporarily

Topstitch around each feather piece.

Making the Tail

Arrange tail feathers in a fan shape.

Mix prints and colors for dimension.

Stitch them together at the base before attaching to the body.

Creating the Chicken Face

Prepare:

- Eye
- Comb
- Wattle
- Beak

Eye Detail

Use:

- Black button
- Felt circle
- Embroidered eye

If using a button:

- Sew securely by hand

Attaching the Comb

Place the comb near the top of the chicken head.

Stitch carefully around edges.

Adding the Wattle

Position below the beak area.

Layer two teardrop pieces for fullness.

Attaching the Beak

Center the beak between comb and wattle.

Topstitch neatly.

Decorative Flower Appliqué

The tutorial includes a flower embellishment on the chicken body.

Cut Flower Pieces

Cut:

- Petals
- Flower center
- Leaves

Use colorful floral fabrics.

Attach the Flower

Place on lower front body area.

Use:

- Zigzag stitch
- Blanket stitch
- Hand embroidery

This adds a beautiful handmade touch.

Step 6: Attaching the Appliqué to the Body

Now attach all decorative pieces to the quilted body panel.

Arrange First

Before sewing:

- Lay all pieces in place
- Step back and check proportions

Typical arrangement:

- Tail at back
- Wing centered
- Face near upper front
- Flower near lower body

Stitch the Pieces

Use slow stitching around curves.

For clean edges:

- Reduce stitch length slightly

You may hand stitch small details for extra precision.

Step 7: Assemble the Tea Cozy

Now the project begins taking shape.

Place Panels Together

Put the two quilted chicken panels:

- Right sides together

Match carefully:

- Top curves
- Bottom edges
- Tail sections

Pin thoroughly.

Sew Around the Outer Edge

Sew around:

- Top
- Sides

Leave the bottom completely open.

Use:

- ¼ inch seam allowance

Clip Curves

Clip small notches around curved areas.

This helps the cozy turn smoothly.

Do not cut through stitching.

Turn Right Side Out

Carefully turn the cozy right side out.

Push curves gently using:

- Chopstick
- Turning tool
- Blunt pencil

Press thoroughly with steam iron.

Step 8: Binding the Bottom Edge

The bottom edge needs a clean finish.

Prepare Binding

Use:

- Bias binding
or
- Fabric strips folded in half

Attach the Binding

Pin binding around the lower edge.

Sew slowly while easing around curves.

Fold binding inward and:

- Hand stitch invisibly
or
- Machine stitch neatly

Step 9: Final Shaping and Finishing Details

Inspect the entire tea cozy carefully.

Check for:

- Loose threads
- Uneven seams
- Open stitching

- Wrinkled areas

Press once more for a polished finish.

Optional Embellishments

You can personalize your chicken tea cozy with:

- Lace trim
- Embroidery
- Buttons
- Beads
- Decorative stitching
- Name labels

Helpful Tips for Success

Choose Quality Cotton

Quilting cotton holds shape best and quilts beautifully.

Use Coordinating Prints

Too many busy prints can overwhelm the design.

Balance:

- Small prints
- Solids
- Medium patterns

Press Frequently

Press after every major seam.

Good pressing creates professional results.

Test Fit Your Teapot

Before final binding:

- Slide the cozy over your teapot
- Ensure spout and handle fit comfortably

Washing Instructions

For best results:

- Hand wash gently
or
- Machine wash delicate cycle

Air dry or tumble low.

Press lightly after washing.
