

Crochet Dragon Wall Organizer Tutorial

This detailed crochet project creates a dramatic purple dragon wall organizer with three front storage pockets, raised wings, a long tail, spikes, horns, and a hanging loop. The finished piece is both decorative and useful for storing remotes, glasses, notes, craft tools, small notebooks, or other lightweight items.

Finished Size: Approximately 18 inches tall x 15 inches wide

Skill Level: Advanced Intermediate

Recommended Yarn: Worsted weight cotton or cotton blend

Hook Size: 4.0 mm for the organizer base and 3.5 mm for details

Materials Needed

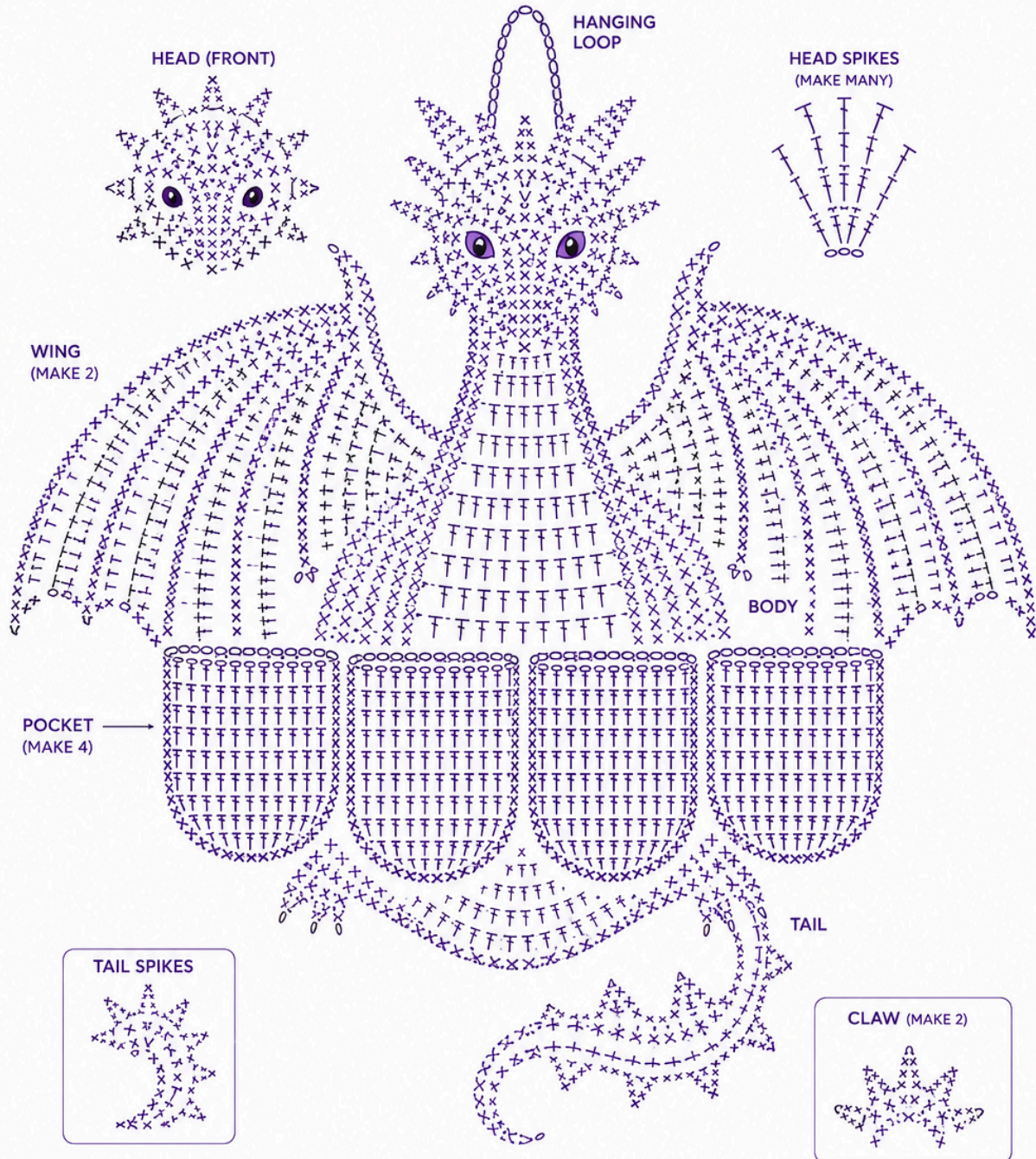
- Purple worsted weight yarn, approximately 550–700 yards
- Dark purple yarn for shadows or details, optional
- Black yarn or safety eyes for eyes
- Polyester fiberfill
- Yarn needle
- Stitch markers
- Scissors
- Wooden dowel or metal ring, optional for hanging support
- Cardboard or plastic canvas, optional for pocket stability

Crochet Abbreviations

- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr = treble crochet
- inc = 2 stitches in the same stitch
- dec = single crochet 2 stitches together
- BLO = back loop only
- FLO = front loop only
- st = stitch
- rnd = round

DRAGON WALL ORGANIZER

CROCHET PATTERN DIAGRAM



STITCH LEGEND (US TERMS)

1. Crochet the Main Back Panel

The back panel supports the dragon and the pockets.

Using purple yarn and a 4.0 mm hook, ch 46.

Row 1: Sc in the 2nd ch from hook and across. You should have 45 sc.

Rows 2–52: Ch 1, turn, sc across.

Your rectangle should measure about **12 inches wide x 16 inches tall**.

To make it stronger, work one round of sc around the entire rectangle, placing 3 sc in each corner.

Fasten off.

2. Make the Bottom Dragon Body Base

The dragon body sits behind the pockets and gives the organizer its sculpted shape.

Ch 28.

Row 1: Sc across.

Rows 2–12: Sc across.

Rows 13–20: Decrease 1 stitch at each end every other row to create a tapered lower body.

This piece should measure about **8 inches wide at the top and 5 inches wide at the bottom**.

Sew it to the lower center of the back panel, leaving the top slightly raised with a small amount of stuffing.

3. Crochet the Three Storage Pockets

Make 3 pockets.

For each pocket:

Ch 18.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and across. You should have 17 sc.

Rows 2–16: Ch 1, turn, sc across.

Work one round of sc around each pocket.

Each pocket should measure about **4 inches wide x 5 inches tall**.

For a thicker rim, work one extra row of hdc across the top edge.

Position the pockets across the lower front of the panel. Sew the sides and bottom of each pocket firmly, leaving the top open.

4. Crochet the Dragon Head

Using purple yarn and 3.5 mm hook:

Round 1: MR, 6 sc.

Round 2: Inc around. 12 sc.

Round 3: 1 sc, *inc* around. 18 sc.

Round 4: 2 sc, *inc* around. 24 sc.

Round 5: 3 sc, *inc* around. 30 sc.

Rounds 6–10: Sc around.

Round 11: 3 sc, *dec* around.

Round 12: 2 sc, *dec* around.

Stuff firmly.

Round 13: 1 sc, *dec* around.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

The head should measure about **3.5 inches long x 3 inches wide**.

Sew the head above the pockets, centered but slightly raised.

CROCHET DRAGON WALL ORGANIZER

Complete Step-by-Step Tutorial



FINISHED SIZE

Approx. 18" (46 cm) wide
x 19" (48 cm) tall
x 4" (10 cm) deep (pockets)

MATERIALS

- Worsted weight (4) yarn
 - Main color (Dragon): ~900 yd (820 m)
 - Accent (Eyes): small amount
- Yarn needle
- Stitch markers
- Stuffing (polyfill)
- Strong yarn or cord for hanging loop
- Fabric glue (optional)
- Scissors
- Blocking mat (optional)

RECOMMENDED YARN

Medium (worsted) weight yarn
100% acrylic or acrylic/wool blend

Example:

- Red Heart Super Saver
- Caron One Pound
- Paintbox Yarns Simply Aran

HOOK SIZE

5.0 mm (H) or 5.5 mm (I) hook

Adjust hook size for your tension.

COLOR GUIDE (Example)

- Main Dragon Color: Royal Purple / Grape
- Accent (Eyes): Bright Purple / Lavender or Pink

ABBREVIATIONS (US TERMS)

ch = chain
sl st = slip stitch
sc = single crochet
hdc = half double crochet
dc = double crochet
tr = treble crochet
2 sc inc = increase (2 sc in next st)

2 sc tog = invisible decrease (sc 2 sts together)
FO = fasten off
st(s) = stitch(es)
rep = repeat
() = work into same stitch
*** = repeat instructions between **

GAUGE (TENSION)

14 sc x 16 rows = 4" (10 cm) in single crochet.

Gauge is not critical, but consistent tension will ensure proper fit.

PATTERN OVERVIEW

1. Head
2. Horns & Spines
3. Wings (Make 2)
4. Body
5. Front Pockets (Make 3 or 4)
6. Tail
7. Hanging Loop
8. Assembly
9. Finishing Details

STEP-BY-STEP PATTERN

1. HEAD
Start with magic ring.
Rnd 1: 6 sc in ring (6)
Rnd 2: 2 sc inc around (12)
Rnd 3: (sc, 2 sc inc) around (18)
Rnd 4: (2 sc, 2 sc inc) around (24)
Rnd 5: (3 sc, 2 sc inc) around (30)
Rnd 6-10: sc around (30)
Rnd 11: (3 sc, 2 sc tog) around (24)
Rnd 12: (2 sc, 2 sc tog) around (18)
Stuff firmly.
Rnd 13: (sc, 2 sc tog) around (12)
Rnd 14: 2 sc tog around (6)
FO, weave in ends.

2 HORNS & SPINES
Horns (Make 2)
Ch 8.
Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook and across (7)
Row 2-10: sc across, ch 1 turn.
FO, leave long tail for sewing.

Spines (Make 10-12)
Ch 6.
Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook and across (5)
Row 2-6: sc across, ch 1 turn.
FO. Pinch base and sew on head, neck and down the back.

3 WINGS (MAKE 2)

Ch 25.
Row 1: hdc in 3rd ch from hook, hdc across, ch 2, turn. (23)
Row 2: hdc across, ch 2, turn.
Row 3: (dc, tr, dc) in next 3 sts, hdc in next 5 sts, sc in next 5 sts, hdc in next 5 sts, (dc, tr, dc) in last 3 sts. Fasten off.
Work a second panel.
Do not fasten off the second panel. Join both panels with sc around outer edge, working 3 sc in each corner and along wing scallops.

4 BODY

Ch 20.
Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook and across (19)
Row 2-40: sc across, ch 1 turn. (Adjust length for body size)
Stuff lightly as you go.
Shape the upper part to match the back of the head and wings.

5 FRONT POCKETS (MAKE 3 OR 4)

Ch 18.
Rnd 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook and around (17)
Rnd 2-16: sc around.
Do not fasten off. Continue to work sc but only in back loops for a clean edge.
Make 3 or 4 pockets.

Sew to the front of the body.

6 TAIL

Ch 25.
Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook and across (24)
Row 2-60: sc across.
Slightly stuff the base.
Curve the tail and taper the last 10 sts with decreases:
(2 sc tog) across.
Add spines along the top.

7 HANGING LOOP

Ch 30.
Sc in 2nd ch from hook and across (29)
Block w/iraf and sew securely to the top of the dragon's head.

8 ASSEMBLY

1. Sew the head to the top of the body.
2. Attach wings to the back on both sides.
3. Sew horns and spines along the head, neck, back, and tail.
4. Attach tail to the bottom of the body.
5. Sew the pockets in place.

9 FINISHING DETAILS

Embroider or add safety eyes.

Glue felt or crochet eyes.

Shape all parts.

Weave in all ends securely.

CROCHET STITCH GUIDE (US TERMS)

Slip Knot
Make a loop and pull yarn through.

Chain (ch)
Yarn over, pull through loop on hook.

Single Crochet (sc)
Insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.

Half Double Crochet (hdc)
Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through all three loops.

Double Crochet (dc)
Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through two loops, yarn over, pull through remaining two loops.

Treble Crochet (tr)
Yarn over twice, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through two loops, yarn over, pull through remaining two loops.

Invisible Decrease (2 sc tog)
Insert hook into front loops of next 2 sts, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.

TIPS

- Use stitch markers to keep your place.
- Stuff the head firmly for shape.
- Block wings lightly for a better shape.
- Use strong yarn for durability if holding heavier items.
- Adjust pocket height to fit your needs.

COMMON METHODS USED

Magic Ring
Starting a round without a hole.

Increase (2 sc inc)
Work 2 sc in the same stitch.

Invisible Decrease
Makes decreases less visible.

Working in Back Loops
Creates a neat edge.

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- Spot clean or hand wash in cold water.
- Lay flat to dry.
- Do not bleach.
- Do not iron.

Enjoy your handmade Crochet Dragon Wall Organizer!
A perfect blend of fantasy and function!

5. Shape the Dragon Snout

Ch 8.

Row 1: Sc across.

Rows 2–5: Sc across.

Round the corners by working sc around the piece.

Lightly stuff and sew to the front of the head.

Embroider nostrils with dark purple or black yarn.

6. Add Eyes and Brow Ridges

For each eye ridge:

Ch 8.

Sc back across.

Sew above each eye area to create a fierce dragon expression.

Attach safety eyes or embroider eyes under the ridges.

For glowing-style eyes, use bright purple or black with a tiny white highlight.

7. Crochet the Horns

Make 2 horns.

Round 1: MR, 4 sc.

Round 2: Sc around.

Round 3: 1 sc, *inc* around.

Rounds 4–8: Sc around.

Stuff lightly.

Sew horns to the top back of the head.

8. Crochet the Head Spikes

Make 6–8 spikes in different sizes.

Small spike:

Ch 5.

Sc in 2nd ch, hdc in next, dc in next, tr in last.

Fasten off.

Large spike:

Ch 7.

Sc in 2nd ch, hdc, dc, dc, tr, tr.

Sew the spikes from the forehead down the back of the head.

9. Crochet the Neck

Ch 16.

Row 1: Sc across.

Rows 2–20: Sc across.

Add texture by working every third row in BLO.

Sew the neck from the head down to the body area.

Lightly stuff before closing the sides so it looks raised.

10. Crochet the Wings

Make 2 wings.

For each wing:

Ch 24.

Row 1: Sc across.

Rows 2–6: Sc across.

Row 7: Dec at both ends.

Rows 8–12: Repeat decreases every other row.

This forms a tapered wing panel.

For wing ribs, ch 18 and sl st back across. Make 4 ribs per wing.

Sew ribs vertically onto the wing.

Add a sc border around the wing.

Attach one wing to each side of the dragon body, behind the pockets. Let the wings extend outward about **5–6 inches**.

11. Add Wing Points

Along the lower edge of each wing, make points:

Attach yarn at the bottom edge.

Sc, hdc, dc, tr, dc, hdc, sc across each section.

This creates the bat-wing shape shown in the image.

12. Crochet the Arms

Make 2 arms.

Round 1: MR, 6 sc.

Round 2: *1 sc, inc* around. 9 sc.

Rounds 3–12: Sc around.

Stuff lightly.

Flatten the top and sew one arm on each side above the pockets.

For claws, attach yarn at the hand and ch 4, sl st back. Make 3 claws per hand.

13. Crochet the Tail

Ch 36.

Row 1: Sc across.

Rows 2–4: Sc across.

Decrease at one end every row until pointed.

Sew the long edge closed around a small amount of stuffing.

Curve the tail downward and to one side.

Sew it to the lower back panel, allowing the tip to curl.

14. Add Body Spikes

Make 10–14 small spikes.

Use the same spike method from Step 8.

Sew them along the neck, back, lower body, and tail.

This gives the dragon a strong fantasy look.

15. Make the Hanging Loop

Ch 28.

Work sl st back across the chain to make a firm cord.

Sew both ends securely to the top back of the organizer.

For extra strength, attach the loop around a small metal ring or wooden dowel.

16. Strengthen the Pockets

Cut pieces of plastic canvas or firm felt slightly smaller than each pocket.

Insert one piece inside each pocket before sewing the top rim, or place it behind the pocket.

This helps the pockets hold remotes or glasses without sagging.

17. Final Assembly

Lay the organizer flat.

Sew pieces in this order:

1. Back panel
2. Body base
3. Pockets
4. Neck
5. Head
6. Wings
7. Arms
8. Tail
9. Spikes
10. Hanging loop

Check that all parts are firmly attached.

18. Finishing Details

Weave in all ends.

Steam lightly, but do not flatten the head, wings, or pockets.

Shape the wings outward.

Curve the tail.

Open each pocket and test with lightweight items.

Your finished **Crochet Dragon Wall Organizer** should be strong, dimensional, and decorative, with three usable pockets and a bold fantasy dragon shape perfect for a living room, craft room, bedroom, or gaming space.
