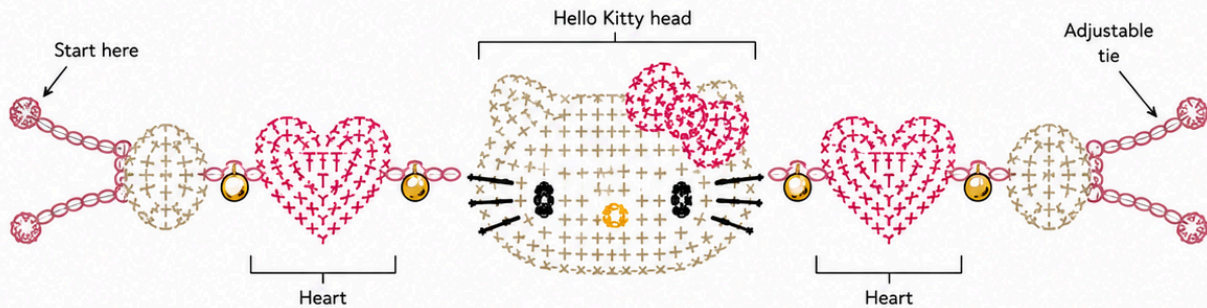
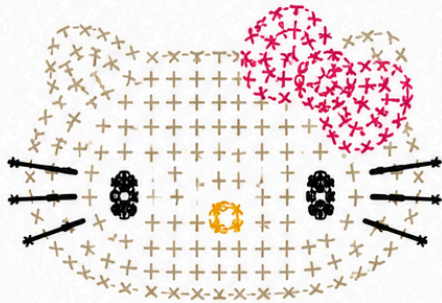


# DIY Hello Kitty Charm Bracelet

## Hello Kitty Crochet Bracelet



HELLO KITTY HEAD



HEART (make 2)



END ACCENT (make 2)



ADJUSTABLE TIE



GOLD BEAD (make 4)



### LEGEND (US TERMS)

- chain (ch)
- slip stitch (sl st)
- + single crochet (sc)
- ⌣ half double crochet (hdc)
- ⌣ double crochet (dc)
- × single crochet (sc)
- ⌣ treble crochet (tr)
- bead
- ( ) repeat
- start here

### NOTES

- Use cotton yarn and a 2.0–2.5 mm crochet hook.
- The number of stitches may vary depending on your tension.
- Adjust the tie length to fit your wrist.

Creating your own Hello Kitty charm bracelet is a fun and adorable crochet project that combines tiny amigurumi details with jewelry-making techniques. This bracelet is perfect as a handmade gift, a cute personal accessory, or even a small craft item to sell.

This tutorial will guide you from the very beginning to the final wearable bracelet using the exact structure shown in the chart. Everything is explained in detail so even beginners can successfully complete it.

The finished bracelet includes:

- A central Hello Kitty face charm
- Two pink crochet hearts
- Small gold jingle bells
- Adjustable bracelet chain with lobster clasp closure

Let's begin!

## Supplies and Materials

Before starting, prepare all your materials carefully.

### Yarn

Use:

- Cotton embroidery floss OR
- Lace weight yarn

Recommended colors:

- White (for Hello Kitty face)
- Pink (for bow and hearts)
- Yellow (for nose detail)
- Black (for eyes and whiskers)

Thin cotton yarn works best because the charms are very small and need neat stitch definition.

## Crochet Hooks

Use a small steel crochet hook:

- 1.0 mm to 1.5 mm

Smaller hooks help create tighter stitches so the charms hold their shape properly.

## Jewelry Hardware

You will need:

- Gold jingle bells (approximately 5 mm)
- Gold jump rings
- Lobster claw clasp
- Small connecting rings

These are essential for transforming the crochet pieces into a wearable bracelet.

## Needles

Prepare:

- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle

The tapestry needle helps weave ends and attach pieces.

## Other Tools

Also needed:

- Small scissors
- Optional: clear jewelry glue for extra durability

## Crochet Terms Legend (US Terms)

Here are the abbreviations used throughout the tutorial:

- ch = Chain
- sl st = Slip Stitch
- sc = Single Crochet
- hdc = Half Double Crochet
- dc = Double Crochet
- tr = Treble Crochet

- inc = Increase (2 sc in same stitch)
- dec = Decrease (sc2tog)
- MR = Magic Ring

If you are a beginner, take a moment to review these stitches before starting.

## Key Measurements and Dimensions

Approximate sizes of the finished charms:

### Hello Kitty Face

- Width: 25 mm
- Height: 18 mm

### Hearts

Each heart:

- Width: 12 mm

### Center Face Base

- Approximate lower width: 10 mm

### Bracelet Length

Total bracelet length is adjustable, usually:

- 6 to 7 inches

You can make it slightly longer or shorter depending on wrist size.

## Step 1: Create the Hello Kitty Face (Component A) 🐱

This is the centerpiece of the bracelet and should be made carefully.

### Round 1: Magic Ring Base

Using white yarn:

Create a Magic Ring.

Work:

- 6 sc into the Magic Ring

Pull the ring tight to close the center completely.

You should now have a small tight circle.

This forms the base of the face.

### Round 2: Increase Round

Work:

- 6 increases around

This means:

2 sc in each stitch around

You will now have:

- 12 stitches total

Your circle should become wider and flatter.

## Round 3: Shape the Face

Work:

- 1 increase
- 1 sc

Repeat gently around according to the pattern shape.

This helps form the wider face structure rather than a perfect circle.

The shape should begin looking slightly oval.

Do not overstuff—this piece stays flat.

## Creating the Ears

Using the upper edge of the face:

Create two small pointed ear shapes by adding a few tiny stitches at the top corners.

Usually:

- small sc
- ch 1
- sl st

This creates the soft cat-ear points.

Keep both sides symmetrical.

## Add the Pink Bow

Using pink yarn:

Attach yarn near the upper right ear area.

Work:

- ch 3
- 3 dc in first ch
- ch 3
- sl st

This creates a tiny decorative bow.

Fasten off and weave in carefully.

The bow should sit neatly above the right ear.

## **Embroider the Features**

Now use embroidery floss.

### **Eyes**

Using black thread:

Create two tiny vertical eye stitches.

Keep them evenly spaced.

Do not make them too large.

### **Whiskers**

Using black thread:

Add 3 whiskers on each side.

Use straight horizontal stitches.

Try to keep them balanced.

### **Nose**

Using yellow thread:

Create one tiny oval stitch in the center.

This small detail makes the face instantly recognizable.

Your Hello Kitty face is now complete.

## Step 2: Crochet the Pink Hearts (Component B)

You need to make:

- 2 hearts

These will sit on both sides of the bracelet.

### Round 1: Magic Ring Heart Pattern

Using pink yarn:

Create a Magic Ring.

Inside the ring, work:

- ch 2
- 3 dc
- 3 tr
- ch 2
- sl st in center

This creates one side of the heart.

Continue the mirrored shape if needed depending on your preferred heart style.

Pull tight gently.

The shape should form a small puffed heart.

### Shape the Heart

Use your fingers to gently shape the top curves.

Adjust the bottom point by tightening slightly.

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing.

Make the second heart exactly the same size.

Consistency is important for visual balance.

## Step 3: Assemble the Charm Chain

Now we begin turning the crochet pieces into a bracelet.

### Prepare the Pink Thread

Use pink thread or strong jewelry cord.

This will serve as the bracelet structure.

It must be strong enough for daily wear.

### Attach the Center Hello Kitty Charm

Place the Hello Kitty face in the center.

Using the tapestry needle:

Carefully stitch through secure hidden points on the back of the face.

Do not stitch through visible front details.

Make sure the charm lies flat.

### Add the Hearts

Attach one heart on each side of the center charm.

Spacing should look balanced and symmetrical.

The arrangement should be:

Heart → Hello Kitty → Heart

### Add the Bells

String the gold bells between and beside the charms.

Suggested visual order:

Bell → Heart → Bell → Hello Kitty → Bell → Heart → Bell

This creates the same cute decorative style shown in the guide.

Make sure bells move freely and are not stitched too tightly.

Check spacing before final tightening.

## **Step 4: Attach Hardware**

Now we add the bracelet closure.

### **Add Jump Rings**

At both ends of the bracelet thread:

Attach small jump rings.

Use jewelry pliers if available.

Open jump rings sideways rather than pulling outward to preserve shape.

Secure tightly after attachment.

### **Attach Lobster Clasp**

On one side:

Connect the lobster clasp to the jump ring.

Close the ring securely.

This will become the opening and closing mechanism.

### **Create Adjustable End**

On the opposite side:

Add an extra jump ring or small extension loop.

This allows size adjustment for different wrist sizes.

Test the clasp several times to ensure smooth opening and closing.

## Step 5: Finishing Touches ✨

This step makes your bracelet stronger and more professional.

### Weave in Loose Ends

Using the tapestry needle:

Hide every yarn tail carefully inside stitches.

Never leave loose ends exposed.

This prevents unraveling later.

### Apply Optional Jewelry Glue

Use:

A tiny dab of clear jewelry glue

Apply only on:

- key knots
- hidden attachment points

Do not overuse glue.

Too much glue can make the bracelet stiff or messy.

Allow it to dry completely before wearing.

## Step 6: Final Assembly and Wear 🎉

You are almost done!

### Check the Final Fit

Try the bracelet on your wrist.

Check:

- comfort
- clasp security
- charm balance
- overall symmetry

Make small adjustments if needed.

## **Final Inspection**

Ensure:

- no loose stitches
- bells are secure
- clasp opens smoothly
- hearts match evenly
- Hello Kitty sits centered

Everything should feel neat and sturdy.
